December 13 - Third Sunday of Advent

John 9:4-5 (NRSV)

We must work the works of him who sent me while it is day; night is coming when no one can work. ⁵ As long as I am in the world, I am the light of the world."

(Related Scriptures: John 11:9 and I Thessalonians 5:16-18)
